The 1<sup>st</sup> Real Senior Prom was held on Saturday, May 24, 2003 at the Weldon Elementary School on Main Street in Weldon, NC. There were nine contestants vying for the title of King and Queen causing much excitement. Children and other family members came home to see their mother or father, grandparent or uncle or aunt in the "Grand March of the Kings & Queens". Some children rented limos to bring their parents to the prom. It was a glorious occasion, and continues to be a highlight event in the lives of the "elders" today.

Our first King and Queen in 2003 were Queen Clementine Fenner Sledge, and King James Harris. Since that time, in the seven year time span, we have held three other proms crowing a king and queen each time. In 2004, Queen Catherine Savage Lockley and King Levy White were crowned. In 2006, Queen Bettie White and King Claude Ford were crowned. In 2008, Queen Hilda Walden and King Levy White were crowned. During this seven year period more than twenty OMS members have sought the title.
